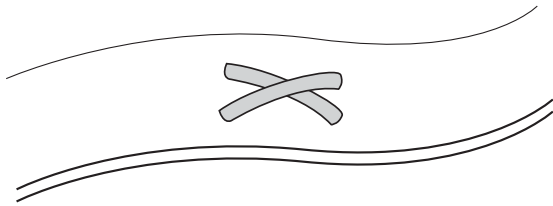


# How to Sew a BUTTON

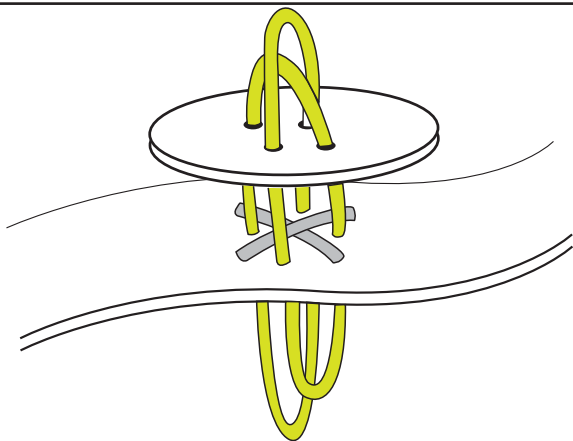


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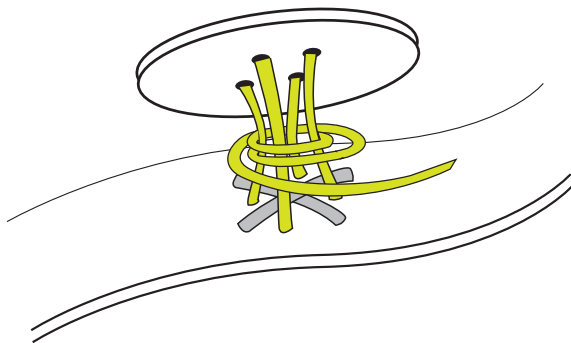
**1. Cut about 12" of thread.**

**Knot at one end and thread your needle. Make a single stitch in the garment about 1/8" inch long, and then make another stitch perpendicular to the first where you need the button to be sewn.**

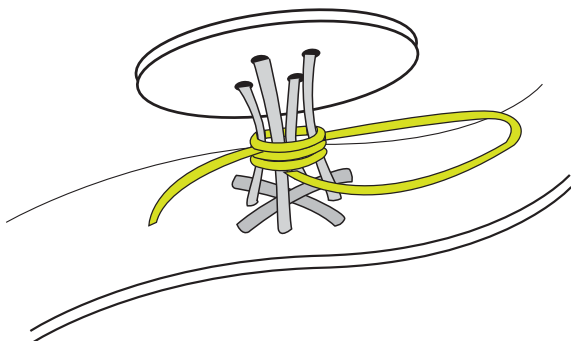


**Hold the button about 1/8" away from the fabric and thread the needle up through one hole in the button and down through the diagonally opposite hole.**

**Do the same with the other diagonal holes. Repeat 4 or 5 times.**



**Wrap the thread tightly around the vertical threads between the button and the cloth to create a tight pillar.**



**Push the needle through this pillar a few times, pull tightly and cut the thread close.**
